#### Report on the Financial Statements

In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the Association's preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the entity's internal control. Accordingly, I express no such opinion. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial statements.

I believe that the audit evidence I have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for my audit opinion.

### **Opinion**

In my opinion, the financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of Humane Farming Association as of December 31, 2019, and the results of its operations and its cash flows for the year then ended in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

# NOTE 1 - GENERAL AND SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

General - The Humane Farming Association is a national, non-profit organization. The organization works to protect consumers from the misuse of chemicals in food production and to eliminate the suffering to which farm animals are subjected. The organization maintains its books on the accrual method of accounting.

Estimates - The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Cash and Cash Equivalents - Humane Farming Association considers all cash on deposit with banks, cash on hand, and highly liquid investments with an initial maturity of three months or less to be cash and cash equivalents.

Inventory - Inventory is carried at the lower of cost or fair market value, using the first-in, first-out method of accounting.

Investments - Investments in equity securities with readily determinable fair market values and all investments in debt securities are reported at their fair market values in the statement of financial position. Unrealized gains and losses are included in the change in net assets.

Property, Equipment and Depreciation - Humane Farming Association capitalizes all acquisitions of property and equipment in excess of \$1,000. Property and equipment are capitalized at cost if purchased and at fair market value if acquired by donation. Depreciation of property and equipment is provided on a straight-line basis over the estimated useful lives of the respective assets.

Income Tax Status - Humane Farming Association is exempt from federal and state income taxes under Section 501 C 3 of the Internal Revenue Code and Section 23701 D of the California Revenue and Taxation Code and has received a permanent IRS determination that it is a public charity under Internal Revenue Code Section 509 A 1. The open years for Federal and State audits are 2016, 2017 and 2018.

#### NOTE 5 - FUNCTIONAL ALLOCATION OF EXPENSES

The cost of providing the various programs and other activities have been summarized on a functional basis in the statement of activity. Accordingly, certain costs have been allocated among the programs and supporting services benefited.

### **NOTE 6 - AFFILIATED ORGANIZATION**

Humane Farming Association is affiliated with Humane Farming Action Fund, a separately incorporated legislative and political action organization which is funded partly by specific project grants from Humane Farming Association and partly by contributions from the public. The Humane Farming Action Fund's revenues are solicited in its own name and its activities are conducted and paid for separately from Humane Farming Association.

#### **NOTE 7 - CONCENTRATION OF CREDIT RISK**

Humane Farming Association had cash deposits at financial institutions in excess of federally insured limits, as well as money market funds at financial institutions that are not insured by either the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation or the Securities Investor Protection Corporation. The Association periodically receives contributions that exceed the federally insured limits and those amounts are splitup and redirected to accounts that are insured. As of December 31, 2019 the Association had no significant concentrations of credit risk.

#### **NOTE 9 - PENSION PLAN**

Humane Farming Association in 1991 adopted a defined contribution pension plan covering all employees aged 21 years or older who have performed a minimum of 1,000 hours and twelve months of service. Contributions are determined annually by the Board of Directors and are based on a percentage of each participant's compensation. Pension plan contribution for the year ended December 31, 2019 was \$266, 600. The pension plan is administered by Humane Farming Association.

#### **NOTE 10 - SUBSEQUENT EVENTS**

Subsequent events were evaluated through June 15, 2020, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.
